## 128th Annual SAR Congress



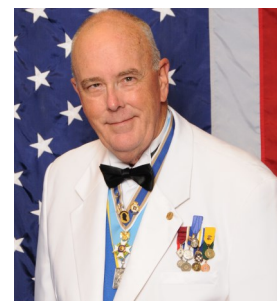
The National Society Sons of the American Revolution hosted its 128th Annual Congress in Houston, Texas from Friday, July 13 through Thursday, July 19, 2018. The business sessions, meetings, and functions were held at the Westin Houston, Memorial City.

## Ohio SAR Holds Summer Meetings at Zoar, Oh.

On July 27th and 28th, the Ohio Society held its quarterly Executive Committee and Board of Management Meetings in Zoar, Ohio at the Firehouse Grille and Pub. Both meetings were well attended, with members present from all Ohio districts.

The Friday, July 27th activities began with an outstanding buffet dinner, followed by the Executive Committee and Ladies Auxiliary meetings. The agenda of the Executive Committee included informative discussions on the activities of committees tasked with special missions.

Saturday, July 28th began with the Board of Management meeting at 8:00AM. Immediately following, our members proceeded to the Fort Laurens Historic Site a few miles away for a Memorial Service at 11:15AM. The meetings were moved to Zoar a few years ago to accommodate a larger membership attendance. This year's meetings coincided with the annual Zoar Harvest Festival.

## Steven Greaf Appointed New Ohio Society Historian

Due to the untimely passing of Dr. James River, the Ohio Society was left with a vacancy in the office of State Historian. The Executive Committee was charged with the task of finding a replacement and Steven Greaf, of the Firelands-Bicentennial Chapter, has been selected to fill the vacancy.

As Historian, Steve will preserve all matters of interest of an historical character which may come to his attention. The Historian also keeps

the records of the historical and commemorative meetings of the Society, and shall supervise the preparation and printing of all its historical publications other than those of the membership rolls.

Steve retired from the U. S. Department of the Treasury and is a retired U. S. Army Reserve Lt. Colonel. He has a Master's in Public Administration from Western Kentucky University and a BA in International Relations from Syracuse University.

The Executive Committee conducted a search following the previous Historian Dr. River's death on May 21 and Steve Greaf was named the new Historian shortly before the Summer BOM meeting. Steve was sworn in as the Historian at that BOM meeting and his oath of office was administered by PG Warren Alter. The Executive Committee would like to thank the other Compatriots that volunteered to serve in this office.

## Fort Laurens: Ohio's Only Revolutionary War Fort

On July 28th, 2018, the Ohio Society Sons of the American Revolution hosted its annual Fort Laurens Memorial Service at the site of this historic Revolutionary War fort in Bolivar, Tuscarawas County, Ohio. Members of the SAR, DAR, C.A.R. and other patriotic groups and organizations, migrate to this ceremony each year, and pay homage to the American soldiers who died in its siege in 1779. This year, SAR members came from Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, West Virginia, Virginia, and Pennsylvania to participate in the ceremony, considered a national event in the National Society SAR organization. Perhaps a brief history lesson will explain why such importance is placed upon this historical site.



Fort Laurens was the first and only fort of the Revolutionary War established within the limits of what is now Ohio, and was built on the banks of the Tuscarawas River, now near the town of Bolivar, Ohio, in December of 1778 by General Lachlan McIntosh. The fort was intended to serve as a defense against attacks by the British and Native American Indians on settlers in the Ohio Country, and was to be a staging point in support of a planned attack on the British at Fort Detroit.

The Fort was named in honor of Henry Laurens, President of the Continental Congress.

Conditions during the winter were harsh, and General McIntosh removed all but 150 soldiers from the 8th Pennsylvania Regiment and the 13th Virginia Regiment to Fort Pitt, present day



Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Beginning February 22nd, 1779 and continuing until mid-March of that year, a small number of British soldiers of the 8th Regiment of Foot commanded by Captain Henry Bird, and a few hundred allied Native American warriors, laid siege to the fort after ambushing a group of defenseless American soldiers who were foraging outside of the compound. Amongst the British forces was the infamous Simon Girty.

During the nearly month-long struggle, the American soldiers were starved and frozen, being forced to eat roots and grass growing within the fort's walls. Some resorted to boiling their own moccasins, making a broth for consumption.

The British forces were also suffering the harsh conditions of that winter, and abandoned their siege on March 20th, 1779. Three days after the siege was lifted, American reinforcements arrived from Fort Pitt. A force of over 100 American soldiers remained at Fort Laurens until August 2, 1779, when it was determined it was no longer of value as a staging point in attacking the British at Fort Detroit, and was abandoned. In total, more than 20 American soldiers died at Fort Laurens.

Today, the Ohio Historical Connection, formerly the Ohio Historical Society, operates a museum at the site of Fort Laurens, under the management of the Zoar Community Association. On site is the Tomb of the Unknown Patri-

ot of the American Revolution, which contains the remains of one of the American soldiers killed here, and discovered during archaeological excavations at the site. This brave soldier was laid to rest with full military honors by the Ohio National Guard in 1976. The remains of other soldiers who were killed during this struggle are interred in a crypt inside of the museum.

The site was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1970. While nothing remains of the fort's walls today, the Friends of Fort Laurens Foundation is actively engaged in fundraising efforts to reconstruct the fort, log by log.

## Ladies Auxiliary

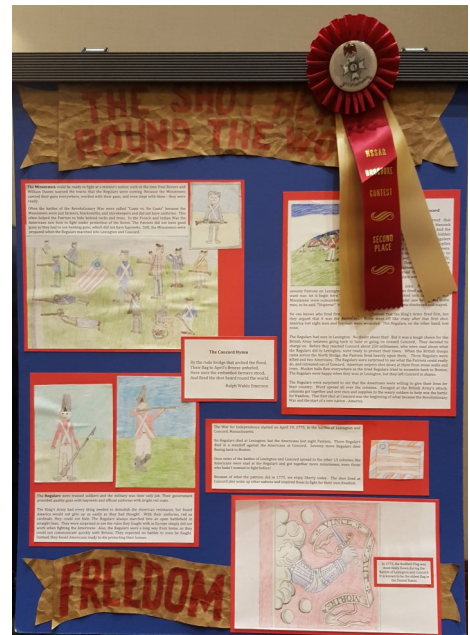
Ladies, we have a new project! Venie Hinson, President of the Ohio Ladies Auxiliary of the OHSSAR presented a USO project at our meeting in May. It is now underway!



We met this past July while at the Fort Laurens weekend activities in Bolivar, Ohio. Fort Laurens is Ohio's only American Revolutionary War fort, built the winter of 1778-79. Soldiers there survived a devastating winter and seige, but barely. Twenty-one soldiers would perish by the time the siege lifted on March 20, 1779. Three days later American relief forces arrived. The Ohio Ladies Auxiliary were proud to honor the Tomb of the Unknown Patriot during the

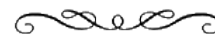

This is the third year they were represented at the fair where all 3 counties Mahoning Valley Chapter encompasses take part and two counties of the Mahoning Chapter DAR come through the gates. Canfield Fair has a yearly attendance over 200,000 people.

## Northwest Territory SAR Honors Area Patriots

Compatriots of the Northwest Territory Chapter in collaboration with John Hancock Chapter, SAR honored three area Patriots on Saturday, September 8 in Pandora, Ohio. Patriots John Morehead, Israel Hubbard, Jr., and Hezekiah B. Hubble were memorialized for their Revolutionary war service.

John Morehead was a private in Capt. Philip Shrawder's Company of Rangers serving on the western frontier of Pennsylvania during the war. Israel Hubbard, Jr. was a private serving four periods with his local Massachusetts militia from 1775 through 1778. Most noted was his statement from his pension application of his witnessing the surrender of General Burgoyne British troops to General Gates after the Battle of Saratoga. And Hezekiah Hubble was a private in the New Jersey Continental Line from 1775 through 1780. He saw action in the Battles of Springfield (NJ) and Brandywine and Monmouth (PA) among other duty during the war.

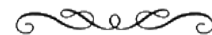
Morehead is buried in the Cholera Cemetery, just east of Gilboa, Putnam County, Blanchard Township, Ohio and Hubbard is buried in the Malahan Cemetery Putnam County, Riley Township, Ohio. Hezekiah Hubble was buried just across the county line in Allen County, Richland Township in the Hubbell Cemetery on Shifferly Road, North of Rockport, Ohio.

Assisting with the ceremonies were the combined veterans color guard and fire squad of Putnam County, the JROTC Army unit from

Kenton High School and the Ohio Society Color Guard. Local area DAR from Findlay and Lima along with the Vice President General of the Central District, NSSAR, Timothy Ward, Ohio SAR State President Shawn Cox and Wm. Tony Robinson, Sr. President of the Ohio Society Children of the American Revolution were in attendance.



The Riley Township Trustees used this opportunity to restore the Malahan Cemetery by resetting markers, adding a split rail fence and placing a marker on the site. The cemetery was originally a family cemetery that over time was abandoned and came under the care of the trustees. Putnam County pioneers dating from the early 1830's through 1870's are buried in this pioneer cemetery.
